

In order to contribute towards the Sustainable Development Goals of the United Nations, ISR provides programmes based on Science and Technology through the use of Engineering and Artistic processes, based on the principles of Mathematics called STEAM. 



Commemoration of National Education Day with a Special Lecture and Book Release.

Date: November 24, 2022



The Departments of Education and B. Ed. of Loreto College, Kolkata, commemorated National Education Day, 2022, with an invigorating lecture and a book launch by the Department of Education. The chief guests were Mr. Barry O'Brien and Mrs. Denise O'Brien. Mrs. Sukanya Mullick began the programme with the welcome speech, which was followed by the lighting of the lamp. Sister Christine Coutinho, Principal of Loreto College, welcomed the gathering and offered a prayer.

Mr. O'Brien, one of India's leading quiz-masters, motivational speaker and notable educationist, discussed the changing role of educators as facilitators of learning. Through his speech, he demonstrated the various skills of effective teaching, drawing examples from his life and experiences. While stressing on the importance of making education relevant for the learners, the speaker encouraged educators to provide vocational training in order to prepare them for the challenges of life.

Mr. O'Brien emphasized the importance of observation and perseverance for being an educationist. He mentioned how Christian missionary schools and Anglo-Indian schools focus on character building. Such a vision is the need of the hour since India's education system has become highly business-oriented. Mr O'Brien encouraged the young audience with the purpose of making a difference in society, and being a unique individual, capable of independent critical thinking.

Dr. Neeta Dang then introduced the book to the audience. She highlighted the many contributions by various educators for this publication, bringing to the fore the essence of education and the need for Creativity, Aims and Technology in Education. Gleanings is an anthology of articles emphasizing the evolution of education and teaching via the transformative nature of Jesuit education, enhancement of the self through education, and how liberalization and the post-truth world have impacted education and our lives.

The event ended with a Vote of Thanks put forward by Dr. Dang and the official book launch by Sr. Coutinho and Mr. And Mrs. O'Brien. The students were once again reminded of the place education has in their life, having learnt effective ways to facilitate the development of young minds.



Report: Poster Making Activity on 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat'


Date: 11th March 2023

Report: Workshop on First-Aid and Health Education Organised by the Institute of Preventive Awareness (IPA), Kolkata


Date: 15th March, 2023

The first-year students of the Department of B. Ed., Loreto College, Kolkata, attended a workshop on 'First-Aid and Health Education' on 15th March, 2023. The workshop was organised by the Institute of Preventive Awareness (IPA). Mr. Pradip Mondal and Mr. Chandan Mitra, the two resource-persons spoke on various common situations where first aid may need to be urgently administered before the injured person can receive proper medical care.

The students learnt about the various pressure points in the body to control bleeding. They volunteered to be part of an exercise where they were taught the tourniquet method of tying a bandage. Interactive methods were used to demonstrate responses to a person suffering from a shock or lowered oxygen concentration, wounds, fractures, burns, or snake bites. Ice water was stated to be the most effective means to treat burns. The students were also explained as to what vaccine was to be administered in case of snake bites. The first part of the workshop ended with an interactive session where the students formed pairs to practice tying a triangular bandage in various ways for fractures.

The second part of the workshop focused on a discussion of healthy foods and practices to follow to prevent diseases such as diabetes, hypertension, and osteoporosis. The workshop concluded with an emphasis on the relevance of meditation in our stressful lives through a guided short meditation accompanied by soothing music.

The students are grateful to Mr. Mondal and Mr. Mitra from the Institute of Preventive Awareness, Kolkata for conducting this interactive workshop which helped the teacher trainees learn essential life skills.







At the end of the programme the participants were able to:-






