ANNUAL REPORT 2019-2020

Loreto College, a leading women's college gratefully acknowledges the status under the **Centre with Potential for Excellence (CPE)** scheme for the **third phase 2015-2020**. The College has been utilizing the grants to advance its standards and further efficacy. The grant has been used in all the endeavours of the College for improvement of the teaching-learning process, in fostering research, in raising consciousness about the environment and community welfare, sensitization towards women's issues and in motivating students to strive for a global academic standard.

The college applied for the **National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF)** status and was ranked **76 in 2019**, by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. Loreto College received the **Sankalp Education Award for College of the Year** September 01, 2019, instituted by the Lions Club International, David and Goliath and FACES.

Loreto College has opted for the **4**th **Cycle** of Accreditation by NAAC in 2019-2020, having received an extension of accreditation for **2 more years** as a **High Performing Institution** in 2017. Loreto College was awarded an 'A' Grade in the 3rd Cycle of Accreditation with CGPA of 3.26 on a 4 point scale. The College has submitted the Self Study Report (SSR) for the 4th Cycle of Accreditation.

The new course **Sociology** (Elective) introduced in July 2017 has successfully entered its 3rd year. The college has commenced another subject – **Statistics** (Elective) in 2019-2020. The infrastructure of the classroom was modified to enable the introduction of the subject.

Construction of the 2nd part of the vertical extension of the building is completed; this part of the vertical extension will need to be furnished before classes can commence after obtaining the Building Completion Certificate from the Municipal Corporation. All necessary arrangements have been made to complete the Fire Safety provisions of the College.

Observations made reveal that students do and are able to fit themselves in various types of employment worldwide, and show high competency. The faculty members have shown interest in the organization of growthful events by inviting eminent academicians as guest lecturers/ resource persons; high standards are maintained with an efficient network of associations towards the **'mission of being'** and the students have done us proud.

Eduquest, a Students' Meet was organized by the Education Department of the College in collaboration with the Bhawanipore Education Society College, '*Mental Health and Hygiene: Social and Institutional Concern*' on November 14, 2019. Historia, organized by the History Department and the History Society of the college, again brought together students from the History Departments of Colleges around Kolkata. This was much appreciated. *Kalakriti*, an annual expression of commitment to inclusivity and to those with disability by the Department of Psychology brings together students from schools for the disabled. This is followed by a seminar. **Ecolore** is an event by the students of the Economics Department wherein students of other colleges come together on a common platform to deliberate on a topical issue in the field of Economics. Likewise, every event in the college celebrates our dedicated service in the cause of youth. The students also participated in academic paper presentations in college and won laurels.

The vision of holistic development is achieved with the help of the grant forwarded under the above-mentioned scheme as depicted in documented records; the College is attuned to the needs of the times and to its stakeholders. A list of Conferences, Seminars and Workshops included indicate the broad spectrum of exposure our staff and students receive and the versatility of the implementation of the vision and mission of the college. The publications and the future plans enlisted and enclosed likewise depict our commitment to the relevance of Higher Education. We wish to grow and develop, enhance higher education and hope to maintain the continuity of excellence with the help of all involved in education.

Student activities and programmes planned for the year were modified so as to accommodate as many activities as possible and to sustain their interest in cocurricular and extracurricular activities. Among the innovative activities organized during the academic year **enrichment courses** as Editing and Publishing, the completion of a course in French, German and Spanish stand out. Courses in Legal Awareness for Women, Calligraphy and Cursive Writing were also offered.

The **Student Council** assumes leadership annually in the college at an **Investiture Ceremony.** The Student Council works hand in hand with the management to ensure

the smooth running of college activities. **Samagam**, the Youth Fest is organized for and by the students. The theme this year was **'Coalescence'** which focused on environmental issues and eco-friendliness through human intervention.

During the year 2019-2020 the college continued to concentrate on building up the academic front with the new CBCS System entering the 2nd year by supporting and encouraging its pupils to strive for excellence. This challenge was taken up on a warfooting; the syllabus was completed on time, keeping in mind co-curricular activities that enhance student growth are not neglected. Mentoring for all students, and remedial classes for slow learners have helped the growth of students in different areas. Advanced learners are motivated to take on **student research projects** under the guidance of teachers. Others took on paid internships in our 'earn while you learn' endeavour.

The interactive session with the renowned journalist Barkha Dutt held at Loreto College on 12 September 2019 was a prelude to the programme, We The Women, which was held on September 30, 2019 at Loreto College. The students spent the day interacting with women of courage who in small and big ways have found a niche for themselves in society and whom our own pupils could learn from and emulate. Many of those who were invited by fearless Barkha Dutt were our past pupils for whom this was home-coming; they have done us proud.

It was a day long event where eminent personalities from various walks of life voiced their stories. Mimi Chakraborty, Nusrat Jahan, Anamika Khanna, Swastika Mukherjee, Madiha Ahmed, Sona Mahapatra, Malavika Banerjee, Ruma Devi, and Jhulan Goswami and many other achievers like them shared their stories of struggle and determination with the audience. Single fathers Tushar Kapoor, Aditya Tiwari and Arnab Dasgupta also had much to share about their journeys, redefining our ideas of masculinity and maternity. Many aspects of today's world including menstruation taboos, single parenting, the Armed Forces, women in politics, and the fashion, sports and film industries were talked about in the programme. Loreto presented a series of monologues, depicting the hardships faced by different women in their day to day lives, followed by a melodious piano recital by two students of the college.

The college students also put up a 'Green Initiatives' stall for the very first time, selling packs of stainless steel straws, cloth bags and vermi compost prepared in college, in order to spread awareness and contribute to the cause of preservation of the environment. It was a very enriching and inspiring experience for all.

On the September 27, 2019 the third year students of our college witnessed a play titled Muskaan, brought forth by Oindrilla Dutt, an alumnus of our college. Starring veteran actress Lushin Dubey and theatre personality Yuvraj Singh, the play dealt with the universal menace of AIDS. The play was conceptualised and directed by Lushin Dubey herself. The play was episodic in structure, with each episode highlighting a different aspect that affects the life of people diagnosed with AIDS. The main character was a woman, Chitra, who had recently been diagnosed with the ailment and the play traces her journey as she meets people from different walks of life and affected by the same ailment as hers at the organisation. It explores the deep and irreversible impact it has on the family life of the people diagnosed as well as how they are ostracised by society. The play also explored and the common myths associated with AIDS and aimed to draw light on the groundlessness of such beliefs. Everyone present in the audience was deeply moved and spellbound by the fantastic performances of the lead actors. The play received a standing ovation by the audience. Overall, the play was a powerful attempt to de-stigmatize AIDS and start a dialogue on the subject.

The Consulate General of Italy, in association with **Culture Monks and Kama Productions**, held a musical evening in the Loreto College Concert Hall, on January 18, 2020, at 6:30pm. The College experienced an awe-inspiring presentation directed by Mr. Pranab Mukherjee and organized by the Culture Monks on the morning of January 17, 2020. the presentation comprised a stage play enacted by the students of Mayo College Girls' School, Ajmer and recitation of breathtaking poetry by the students of B.K Birla Centre for Education of Pune. The stage play highlighted the horrific incidents of Jallianwala Bagh, the shooting of Gauri Lankesh, the Barbarous rape case of Kathua and the rage they instilled in young minds. The maturity of the actors was reflected in the sensitivity with which they addressed the issues. The audience was deeply moved by the performance. The striking feature of the programme was inclusiveness in language as the recitation was bilingual. Mr. Mukherjee also shared various experiences of his life which he acquired during performing stage plays.

The '**Songs of Love and Destiny'** was a concert of songs of Rabindranath Tagore, translated in English by Alain Daniélou, and performed by Italian artists- Francesca Cassio (vocals) and Gloria Campaner (piano). A total of eight songs, chosen from the various 'Porja's of Rabindra Sangeet were performed. Each of them were perfectly arranged and beautifully presented. Several Italian dignitaries, the Consul General of Italy, and Deputy Consul General, Kolkata and the Director of the Italian Cultural Centre, New Delhi graced the occasion with their presence. The audience were gifted a musical evening which truly proved how music can transcend the social,



geographical, as well as linguistic boundaries of the man-made world and infuse a sense of happiness in every heart.

On February 14, 2020, the **Women's Study Society** of Loreto College in collaboration with Basanti Devi College and The Bhawanipur Education Society College organized a Panel Discussion, **Social Injustice: Issues, Challenges and Proposed Suggestions for Gender Equality.** The panelists' range covered multiple socio-economic and political issues including the recent 'Me Too' movement showcasing the state of injustice meted out to women. The discussion centered round the idea of feminism still being relevant in the current patriarchal scenario. The panelists deliberated on fewer women being represented in the organized sector though there were more women in higher education than before; however, even with enhancement in higher education there were not enough women representatives in politics. The session was attended by students and staff of Loreto College along with teachers and students from other colleges who were much enriched by the proceedings.

The **Annual Sports Day** held at the Loreto Entally Grounds brought a homely feeling and the event was enjoyable. The staff and students were introduced to Kolkata Mary Ward Social Centre in the campus.

Several times, our students have enabled gifting life by voluntarily donating whole blood to patients who were at death's door. An **Annual Health Camp** for all the Nonteaching staff of the campus organized by NSS, Social Service, LTS and AICUF was successfully attended and diagnosis and treatment of ailments commenced.

The college Outreach Programme of women empowerment, the '**Women's Cell'** founded by retired teachers of the college, and supported by past pupils and wellwishers completed its 23rd year. This Cell supports the education of '**drop-in'** women students whose school education, for reasons beyond their control, was interrupted. In Loreto College, they resume their studies and on completion of NIOS Class XII they choose whether or not to join UG education in the college or opt for a vocational course.

A **barrier-free college**, students with disability blossom with us. A student with visual disability and two who are bravely battling with malignancies feel at home with us. Another student with 86% disability is pursuing her second year B.A. course.

The college has signed a **Memorandum of Understanding** for academic collaboration with The West Bengal State University and the SNDT University, Mumbai. A Seminar to seal the collaboration in the pipeline.

A **workshop on Self-Protection** was conducted for all Staff members, both UG and PG faculty. The initiative of the ICC of the College was an eye-opener for the staff and exposed them to possible implications of sexual harassment.

The 2nd and 3rd issues of the college newsletter **Glimpses** were released. A colourfully depictive biannual, in online and hard copy form describes interesting and memorable activities of college life. It was a pleasant surprise for all to see how much had been done in six months!

At the request of UGC (ERO), the college hosted a **NAD Workshop** in July 2019 in the Auditorium and **Deeksharambh** – **Student Induction Programme (SIP)** in the Concert Hall on November 2019. We feel honoured to be able to **share our infrastructure**.

Growth, progress and **values** have been keywords leading to the development of the college, while availing of the opportunities offered to us. Furthering the charisma of our Founder, Mary Ward, whose faith in women inspires us and who said, '... Women in time to come will do much' is the spark that glows in our hearts. May our service to women and the girl child continue to bear fruit in the years to come.



Presentations by Students:

The Evaluation for Second Year, Semester III, Education Honours on the Unit IV in the CBCS Syllabus 'Educational Management' was done with different games prepared by the students. DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

The Psychology Society of Loreto College, formed in 2009, aims to use comprehensive means to explore the intricacies of the human mind in order to reach out to the society at large.

On August 24, 2019, the society took up the initiative of organizing a talk about the career prospects in the branch of Industrial Psychology laying emphasis on the field of advertising and marketing. The resource person for this talk, Ms. Nabanita Chatterjee is a Senior Account Executive at one of the leading Advertising firms, Ogilvy and Mather. The department of Psychology was enriched by Ms Chatterjee's experiences and gained much knowledge about how advertising plays a major role in the consumer industry. Every advertisement should fulfill the aim to inform, persuade or remind customers about the brand or product. The highlight of good advertising revolves around the connection built with the customer on a personal level which ultimately decides the brand loyalty. Several video clips of unique advertisements were shown which helped us to understand the field of marketing in a better way. (Examples: The Carer, Seesound, Audi, Dove, Always etc). The students were grateful for this learning experience and attained a clear vision about their future

The Society organized its annual event 'Kalakriti - An Amalgamation across Different Levels of Ability' on September 14, 2019. With the aim to spread awareness and acceptance of differently-abled children, it comprises of a series of fun-filled events which encourages the children to exhibit their creative skills. Self-expression and creativity is not only joyous but also holds therapeutic value. A joint exposure of our students with children across the wide spectrum of abilities helps in sensitization both ways. Differently-abled children from different special schools like Akshar, Noble Mission, Mentaid, Behala Bodhayan, Reach, Manovikas Kendra, Sarva Shiksha Mission and Indian Institute of Cerebral Palsy participated in off-atage events - 'T-shirt painting' where participants used colours to paint on the topic "Save The Planet"; 'Collage Making' in which participants prepared a collage on the theme 'Scenery'. The on-stage events were – 'Go As You Like', where participants dressed up as characters of their choice: 'Group Song With A Twist' in which participants performed a group song accompanied by unconventional music; 'Group Dance' where participants performed a dance sequence. The children were much encouraged as their effort was rewarded with certificates and prizes.

'Dialogue' was held on January 20 and 28, 2020. The event which involves a screening of a short film followed by a healthy discussion by the students of the department along with the teachers thus increasing the enthusiasm and participation leading to hearty acceptance of each other's views

Other Departmental Activities

The Psychology Society also organized an event Psynthesis for the Inter-Collegiate Annual Fest: Samagam 2019, participant colleges in the event were National Institute of Fashion Technology (NIFT), Bhawanipore Educational Society College, Lady Brabourne College, St. Xavier's College, and the host, Loreto College. The event consisted of two levels: 'Eyespy'- an off-stage event for which the participants had to solve a crime mystery by using analytical thinking and problem solving skills. The second level was an on-stage event named 'Act Your Age' where the participants had to enact a topic which was divided into 4 sections of developmental periods namely Infancy, Adolescence, Adulthood, and Old Age representing the respective behavior patterns of each age group. Based on their impartial and infallible judgement, the winning trophy was received by Lady Brabourne College. They were followed by Loreto College in the second position and St Xavier's College standing in the third. 
Major Achievements

- For the academic session 2018-2019, first batch of Human Rights (GE/CC1) appeared for the examination. A total of 14 students appeared for the External Examination. A total of 14 students secured a first class. The highest score was 96 out of 100. Two students scored 96.

Guest Lecturer/Special Lecture/Field Visit

- The Department of Human Rights and Department of Journalism and Mass Communication jointly organized a Two Day's Workshop for students. The Workshop was organized on August 7-8, 2019. The theme of the workshop was The Responsible Use of Social Media and Role of Youth in Good Governance. 

Publication by the Department

 Bengali Department has published a wall magazine on famous writers of Nineteenth Century compiled by Semester I elective students. The whole process helped them to understand the topic very clearly, increased their creativity and interest about the subject. It was a learning process for them, as to how they can proceed for simple research work. Above all through this activity they learnt the basic rules of teamwork.

Innovations Introduced

- Two separate book review sessions were organized for first year and second year Bengali Elective students. The students were enthusiastic and actively took part in this activity. This encouraged the students and helped them to improve their writing skill
- This year the students have completed a project file on 'book review session'
- Use of audio-aids in teaching. Some special classes taken with first years', where audio cassettes are played to discuss and to make them understand the difference between the history of eighteenth and nineteenth century drama this has been very interesting and very useful for their CCI/GE (History of Literature). The students enjoyed these classes
- CDs of Tagore's drama song was used to explain the difference and influence of opera singing, that was appreciated by Tagore in 1878 & to enable the pupils to understand the influence of the essay "Function & Origin of Music" by Herbert Spenser
- CD of Tagore's drama- 'Balmiki Pratibha, Kalmrigaya, Bisarjan, Raktakarabi, Dakghar', were played (selected portions) help in the understanding of the difference and development of Tagore's opera like drama, classical drama, and dance drama
- CD of 'Tinertalawar' by Utpal Dutta, was played to explain the time period & history of new Bengali modern drama, which emerged after Girish Ghosh

Visual aid:

The film Postmaster (Tin Kanya) by Satyajit Ray was screened by the Department, this helped in the discussion of short stories of Tagore. The screening evoked many arguments from the students as to how Ray has adapted the short story. There were 2/3 interactive classes after the screening. It helped them to understand the complexity of the story; the class and they enjoyed

Graphical evaluation:

New grading system has been introduced to motivate the students. They made a graph, pointing out their class work and tutorials. The graphical representation helped them understand the quality of their performance for self-evaluation. This documentation is attached in the departmental mark book

Remedial teaching

The weak students are always encouraged to stretch their potential. Those who for some reason do not succeed are helped with respect and concern in their second attempt. Slow learners are given advice and regular class work by the faculty. They are helped both academically and personally. They are helped and encouraged with personal care and attention

Mentoring

Mentoring has helped the personal growth of the students

Educational tour

First year students were taken by the faculty to some eminent places of Kolkata, like Jorashako Thakurbari, Raja Rajendrakrishna Mullik's Marble Palace, and Swami Vivekananda's house. They enjoyed the tour, which helped them to know about famous persons like Rabindranath Tagore, Debendranath Tagore; and they learnt about the history of cultural heritage and architecture of Nineteenth Century Bengal. This tour helped enlightened them especially in understanding the history of literature of nineteenth century. They prepared a report on the tour.

Student's Seminars and Presentations

First Year Bengali Elective Students presented papers on 19th century Bengali Prose/Drama/ Poetry/Periodicals. From the vast area of Nineteenth Century Bengali Literature, they were asked to select a topic within the time frame and present a paper in the class. They were enthusiastic and eager to perform. Their presentations were appreciated.

Interdisciplinary paper presentation: Students of third semester students choose a topic from the 3 GE paper(poetry and drama) and to compare the subject with film, painting, songs, any other visuals, or any other art form, and to present the topic. Creating something by thinking across boundaries between academic discipline or schools of thought. The traditional subject featured differently to the students, when examined by different disciplines. This activity took place for two days, in the 'Media Lab' of the College, before Puja vacation.

B.Ed. DEPARTMENT

Major Achievements

- The teacher trainees are sought after and receive immediate placements after the final results were declared
- The members of the GEMS Education, UAE visited Loreto College on July 10-11, 2019 to address the students of Department of B.Ed. and offered them

opportunities for employment in the GEMS educational institutes in UAE. GEMS Education is a well-known internationally acclaimed education institution and its Education Vice President, Mr. Darryl Bloud and his team interacted with students explaining the opportunities and benefits that the institute can offer to its potential recruits

- On July 26-27, 2019, a Workshop on Learning through Photography (LTP) was conducted for students of the Department of B.Ed. by Dr. Katie Hyde and her team from Duke University. The workshop emphasized on how photography helps in subjective and objective learning. The students were also engaged in a photo tour of the college campus and neighbourhood, learning how students could be exposed to curriculum through photography. The workshop stimulated interest and creativity among the teacher trainees who became equipped to apply photography as an alternative learning approach quite different from regular lessons
- On August 31,2019 Mrs. Piku Choudhury, a distinguished scholar of Archaeology and History, presently the Head, Department of History in The Shri Ram School, Delhi; a former student of Loreto Convent, Darjeeling; former Lecturer and Coordinator of Department of B.Ed. of Loreto College, Kolkata, delivered a lecture on 'Classroom: From Theory to Practice' to the students of Department of B.Ed
- Department of B.ED. Loreto College, was chosen by Jadavpur University for a workshop under a Project by RUSA. On November 16, 2019, the Department of B.Ed. hosted a workshop to sensitize future school teachers to diversity and differences in the classroom conducted by Department of English, Jadavpur University as a part of a project under RUSA entitled 'Bodies of Difference: Pedagogies of the Marginal in the Global South', addressing the issue of 'differences in identities in gender, caste, class, ethnicity and (dis)ability' helping all participants to learn appropriate ways to deal constructively with forms of diversity in the classroom and sensitizing students. The workshop included an excellent theatrical representation by students of Jadavpur University depicting the theme.
- On November 23, 2019, Swachh Bharat cleaning drive was held by students of Department of B.Ed. in collaboration with NSS Society. The students cleaned the college campus, the classrooms, library, common room, the front porch, the back lawn area, the canteen and the neighbourhood area outside the college gates. LORETO COLLEGE CENTRAL LIBRARY

Keeping in mind the VISION and the GOAL of the Institution, the LIBRARY MISSION IS:

To support the teaching, learning and research activities of the College by providing information resources in an appropriate range of formats, suitable study space and facilities for individuals and groups, and efficient user-focused services, thereby enabling the development of empowered women through self-learning.

Loreto College Library provides to its users a lasting contact with a storehouse of knowledge. It is a fully equipped lending library providing information to all who wish to pursue self-learning.

The library holds material covering a wide range of subjects, larger part of which is in English, although an important part of it covers literature in Bengali, Hindi as well as some European languages. Also, there are old and interesting collections of Biography, Philosophy and Religion. The library holdings mainly cover the disciplines of Social Sciences, Arts, Literature, History, Computer Application and English Language. With opening of the Departments of Mathematics, Statistics, Sociology and Post Graduate English, the collection in these subjects have been considerably augmented.

About 30 old books have been digitalized for preservation and made available to students and teachers through Dspace. E-books and e-Resources from Nlist-INFLIBNET are also made available as well as e-books purchased by the Library.

Apart from the Central Library, books are housed in the Seminar Libraries of each Honours Department, namely, English, Economics, Education, Geography, History, Political Science, Psychology and the Departments of Hindi, Bengali, Journalism, Film Studies, Mathematics as well as in the Post Graduate and B.Ed Library.

Both lending and reference documents are arranged in the numerical sequence of the Dewey Decimal Classification System 21st edition.

Membership is open to all staff members and students of Loreto College, Kolkata. Past pupils pursuing higher studies are also allowed access with special permission from the Principal and on payment of a fee. Members of the Community of Loreto nuns are special members of the Library. Retired teachers and teachers of the Women's Cell too are borrowing members.

IMPLEMENTATION OF ACTION PLANS FOR 2019-2020

The B.Ed. Department

 Achieved excellent results – Calcutta University B.Ed. Examination of 2019 (All candidates received 1st class and the highest was 82% in Semester I, 82. % in Semester II, 91.2% in Semester III and 87.2 % in Semester 1V). This is the eleventh consecutive year of such results.

- The teacher trainees are sought after and receive immediate placements after the final results were declared.
- The members of the **GEMS Education, UAE** visited Loreto College on July 10-11, 2019 to address the students of Department of B.Ed. and offered them opportunities of employment in the GEMS educational institutes in UAE. GEMS Education is a well-known internationally acclaimed education institution.
- Department of B.ED. Loreto College, was chosen by Jadavpur University for a workshop under a Project by RUSA. On November 16,2019, the Department of B.Ed. hosted a workshop to sensitize future school teachers to diversity and differences in the classroom conducted by Department of English, Jadavpur University as a part of a Project under RUSA entitled 'Bodies of Difference: Pedagogies of the Marginal in the Global South', addressing the issue of 'differences in identities in gender, caste, class, ethnicity and (dis)ability' helping all participants to learn appropriate ways to deal constructively with forms of diversity in the classroom and sensitizing students. The workshop included an excellent theatrical representation by students of Jadavpur University depicting the theme.

Celebration of Mahatma Gandhi's 150th Birth Anniversary

As the Nation celebrated the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi on 2nd October, 2019, the 'Women's Cell' of Loreto College, Kolkata in collaboration with the B.Ed. Department organized a garlanding ceremony to commemorate the Father of the Nation on 25th November, 2019.. The programme began with paying floral tributes to Mahatma Gandhi followed by the students singing the notable bhajan widely popularized by Gandhiji himself "Ragupati Raghav Raja Ram".


Seminars conducted for Staff and Students of the College

Homes for the Aged, Orphanages, Rural schools, Rainbow Homes, Shishu Bhavan, Homes for the Abandoned at Kalighat, Shanti Dan and Homes for persons with disability are visited by the pupils. The impact in many cases has resulted in continued service to NGO's and the disadvantaged even after they leave college. The NSS society organized a *Health Camp* in collaboration with Lions Club to provide free medical check-ups to the 3rd year pupils and the Support Staff. On November 23, 2019 the society with the B.Ed Department of the college organized a *cleaning drive* in the college premises and neighbourhood. In the month of December, *relief for Bulbul storm* was collected. **The Annual Slum Camp**, a visit to *St Joseph's Home* for the elderly and a *Cancer Awareness Programme* were also organized by the NSS Society.

A **Malaria and Dengue Awareness Programme** was organized by the NSS society in collaboration with College of Medicine and JNM Hospital, on August 29, 2019.

The NSS Society of Loreto College **adopted a primary school, Bal Siksha Sadan** in Park Street.

Blood Donation Camp was organized on July 30, 2019.

The LTS Society organized **TEEN DUCTUS**, August 2019 where young minds came together and spoke on social issues. The main objective of this programme was to enhance the soft skills of the pupils.

International Year for the Rights of Disabled Persons was observed by the Department of Human Rights on December 3, 2019.

The Department of Human Rights organized a **Legal Awareness and Waste Management Workshop** for third year students on January 16, 2020. The focus of the workshop was to enrich students about important legal rights every woman needs to know. The workshop also attempted to teach students about importance of waste management and ways to live a sustainable lifestyle. The workshop was conducted by Ms. Monalisa Saha. Assistant Professor, Department of Law, Burdwan University.

International Women's' Day was marked by the felicitation of an LCM Awardee (Lakshmi Chatterji Memorial Award) to Dr. Reena Sen, former student and former Executive Director, Indian Institute of Cerebral Palsy (IICP) and Hony. Secretary of IICP for her lifelong commitment to empowerment of women through emancipation and rehabilitation on March 7, 2020.

Women's Cell

Loreto College has made a pioneering contribution of empowering women from the weaker sections through education. More than 22 years ago, these young women were taught basic language skills in Hindi and English. They now appear for the Secondary (Class X) and Senior Secondary (Class XII) Board Examinations conducted by National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS). It is a matter of pride that some proceed to earn a B.A. Degree from Loreto College.

This year is the 23rd Anniversary of the foundation of the Women's Cell. The students of the Women's Cell, Loreto College paid tribute to Mahatma Gandhi on his 150th Birth Anniversary. In an interesting, informative programme they highlighted various aspects of the Mahatma's personality. This was a collaboration with the UG and B.Ed. Department.

Other stories threw light on the Mahatma's life-long commitment to peace, nonviolence and universal brotherhood. The programme was given a fresh dimension by a choir consisting of our students. They gave beautiful renditions of Gandhiji's favourite bhajans and hymns. Starting with "Raghupati Raghav Raja Ram" the event ended with "Abide with Me"

The presentation concluded by drawing attention to the wide-reaching influence of Gandhiji's thought. Philosophers, scientists, activists, the greatest minds of the 20th century have felt power of his ideas.

These confident empowered young women enjoy a good level of economic independence by working as teachers, shop assistants or by selling craft items that they make. Their association with Loreto College encourages them to learn the importance of discipline, good behaviour and a sense of responsibility. Our girls become an asset to their families and the community.

Loreto College shall always be indebted to Mrs. U. Bubna the founder of Women's Cell and her team of dedicated teachers comprising of retired teachers, former students, present teachers of the Loreto House School and the college for their fidelity and commitment to the underprivileged.

The Alumnae Association of Loreto College

The Alumnae Association along with the students of the college organized an Open Day and Gala Reunion on February 8, 2019. Women entrepreneurs and NGO's put out their wares and crafts for sale. Parents of the college students, Alumnae and well-wishers actively participated in this annual event.

The Alumnae Association organized the Past Pupils Reunion which saw an overwhelming response of more than 200 past pupils return college. It is home-coming on this day for many former students of the college.

STUDENT VENTURES

One of the major achievements of the Department of Geography was the completion of an Internship Project by six final-year students with the Department of Environment, Government of West Bengal. The topic of the Internship Project was **'The Miracle that is West Bengal - Fires and Stubble Burning in West Bengal'.** The highlights of the report were presented on August 27, 2019 to the Principal Secretary of the Department of Environment, Government of West Bengal.

Harrshita Murarka, Third Year Education Honours student awarded the **Change Champion** and TCC-REX Karmveer Global Young Leaders Fellow (GYLF), instituted by iCONGO in partnership with United Nations.
