The Chairperson introduced the new members of IQAC and welcomed the existing members.

Agenda 4: Minutes of the previous meeting

The coordinator read out the minutes of the previous meeting held on June 18, 2022. The minutes were passed by Mrs. Amita Prasad and seconded by Prof. Debasish Biswas.

Agenda 5: Matters arising from minutes

The coordinator updated the members on the following:

- She informed the members that in response to the suggestion put forward by Ms. Aparajita Roy, the then Vice-President of the Student Council in the last meeting held on June 18, 2022, IQAC has initiated a 30-hour course on Logical Reasoning and Data Interpretation for Semester 3 and Semester 5 students. The students will be assessed at the end of the course and certificates will be issued.
- She also informed the members that in response to another suggestion put forward by Ms. Aparajita Roy in the last IQAC meeting, the college has arranged for a Talk on Gynecological Issues in the month of September under LEADS.
- A 30-hour Advanced Course in Mathematics will commence tentatively in January 2023.

Agenda 9: AOB

Dr. Sayantani Chatterjee brought up the proposal of peer teaching. Dr. Suranjana Mitra, informed the members that the Department of Economics had started with Peer Teaching but it was discontinued as the juniors who were given guidance were reluctant to attend the classes as they did not feel that they were benefitting. Sr. Christine Coutinho suggested that students be divided into groups and each student could be explaining a particular point in the syllabus to the others in the group. It will also encourage reference and research on the particular topic This was a great success in the Political Science Department.

Mrs. Khullar while appreciating the number of events organized by the College asked whether the students have engaged in any particular project which will involve them in a more streamlined manner for a cause. She gave the example of adopting a school or a village or even nurturing the college garden. Sister informed the members that the students undertake 12 hours of community service which is compulsory. Sister Christine stated that students need to give time and value to a project. She further enumerated that they have adopted a village Harishpur but most students at this stage have yet to show commitment but will accompany the NSS staff whenever the village is visited. Mrs. Kaustava Banerjee stated that the B.Ed students undertake 30 hours community service whereby they offer their services to Manovikas Kendra, homes for the aged and other organisations. Dr. Ghosh stated that students under the banner of NSS teach school children thrice a week which have greatly aided the school students. She further stated that they were working towards women's empowerment. Thus, there are not only sporadic projects but long-term assignments undertaken by the students.

Ms. Prasad said that such initiatives may be made mandatory for the students to begin with which will inculcate an interest among the students who later would be involved on their own volition for the right reasons. This could be started in the 1st year.

The student President Annwasha Chatterjee stated that when the students have some innovative ideas, they do not know whom to approach to share their ideas. So, she suggested the formation of a student committee for this purpose. Sr. Christine Coutinho suggested that the students could go to the Class Representatives who need to be primed in order to help them encourage students to undertake new projects. She said if the teachers could initiate and get feedback from the students then it will be more effective.

She gave the example of the college has set up a gymnasium centre with an instructor following feedback from the students.

Prof Debasish Biswas informed the New Education Policy will be implemented from 2025-26. The new SSR has six questions as to how the college is preparing for the NEP. He suggested that the college should go through the policy and organize webinars related to preparation for NEP. He suggested that the college can identify areas where the college will be able to develop keeping in mind NEP, especially moving towards autonomy.

Ms. Prasad suggested that since the college has signed MOUs with 10 different colleges, the college could engage in Student Exchange Programmes which would greatly widen the horizons and lead to life- changing experiences for the students along with the webinars which are giving the students immense exposure. Sister informed the members that Providence College is willing to initiate an Exchange Programme with Department of English of Loreto College.

Mrs. Khullar suggested that the college could approach Calcutta Business School under the aegis of Shri Shikshayatan College, they organise webinars for students on different aspects of financial management.

Sr. Christine Coutinho informed that the college is building cantilever classrooms. We have obtained the No Objection Certificate from the Fire Department. The college hopes to start masters in Psychology from next year if Calcutta University grants permission. Dr. Debasish Biswas suggested that the college could approach Prof. Koushiki Dasgupta Vice Chairman (Academic), West Bengal State Council of Higher Education.
